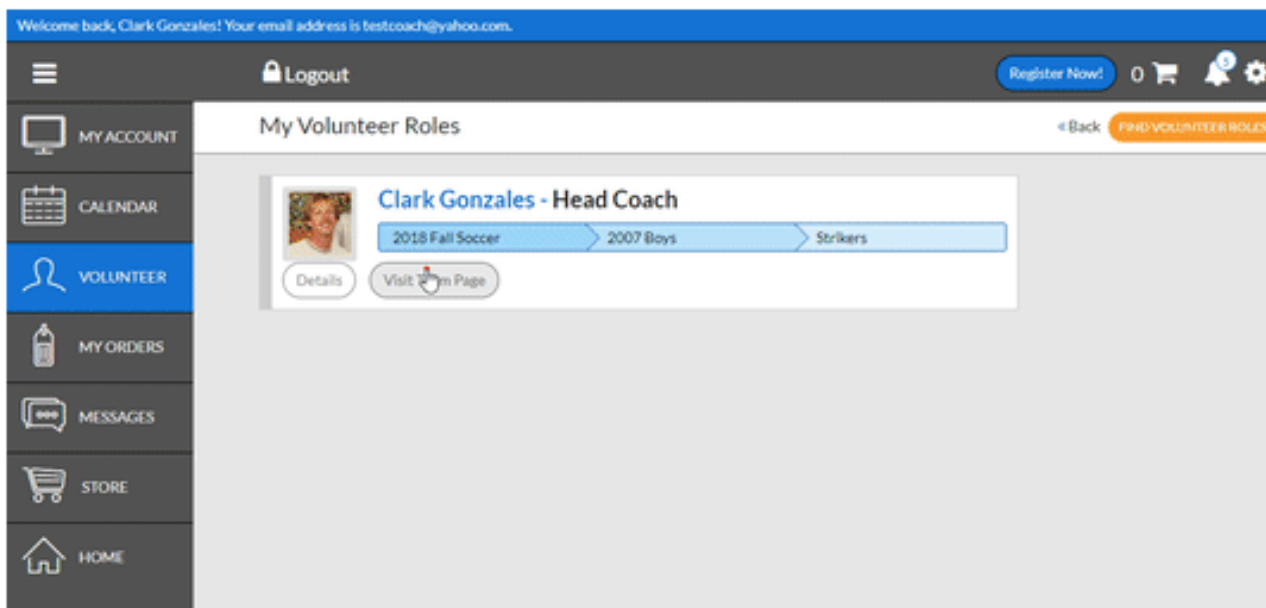
Set Expectation Level

The Rules

Rules – Key Points

- Ball in and out of play
 - U6/U7 try to limit stoppage
 - Throw in technique not important
- Coaches on the field only at U6
- Substitution Rule – free substitution, but strongly encourage substitutions at quarter breaks



The Rules

Rules – Key Points

- No Goal Keepers U6, U7, U8
- Parents at opposite side of field – U8 and older
- No Offside Rule enforced until U12
- No Slide Tackling U10 and younger – safety
- No Talking to Referees

Condensed Rules of Soccer for the AYSO Region 803 / Fall 2022

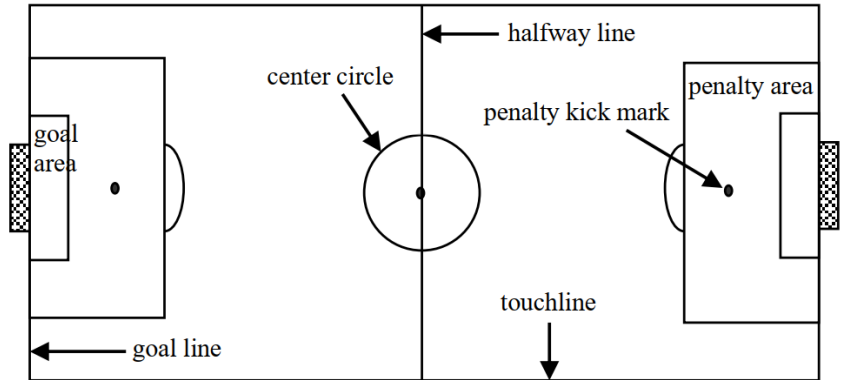
1. FIELD OF PLAY (see diagram)

2. THE BALL

Size 5	U14 & up
Size 4	U9 thru U12
Size 3	U8 & below

3. NUMBER OF PLAYERS

U6	4 per side , no goalkeeper, no referee.
U7&U8	4 per side , no goalkeeper.
U9&U10	7 per side which includes a goalkeeper
U11&U12	9 per side which includes a goalkeeper
U14 & up	11 per side which includes a goalkeeper.



4. PLAYER UNIFORMS

Uniform will consist of a jersey, shorts, socks, shin guards (covered by socks), and footwear. The player shall not wear anything that is dangerous to another player (jewelry, casts, improper footwear). The goalkeeper shall wear colors that distinguish him/her from the other players and from the referee. Casts (hard or soft) are not allowed in either games or practice.

5. REFEREES

One referee shall be appointed to officiate each match for ages U8 and older. The referee is responsible for control of the game and his/her decisions are final. Registered parents who have taken the referee/linesperson clinic will be asked to act as referee on the field if an official referee is not available.

6. LINEPERSONS

Two linespersons assist the referee by indicating when the ball leaves the field of play and, in such circumstances, which team is entitled to the ball. For most league games, one linesperson is to be provided by each team from parent volunteers.

7. DURATION OF THE GAME

The duration of the game shall be two equal periods of time as shown in the following table, unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by the referee and both coaches. At halftime, the interval shall not exceed five minutes except by consent of the referee. Quarter breaks will be called at U10 and younger age groups. For U12 and up, quarter breaks will be called if desired and agreed upon by the referee and both coaches.

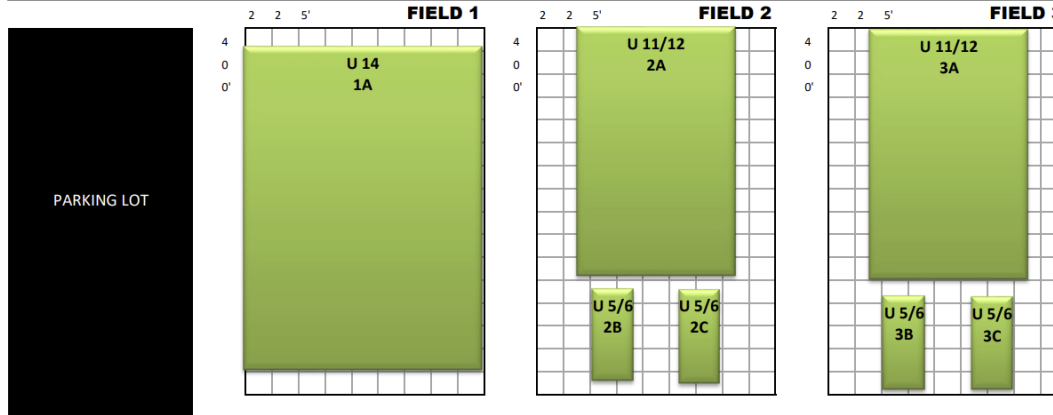

SOCCER PARK LAYOUT - Fall 2022

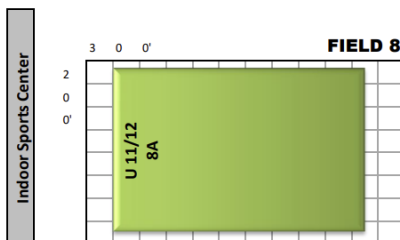
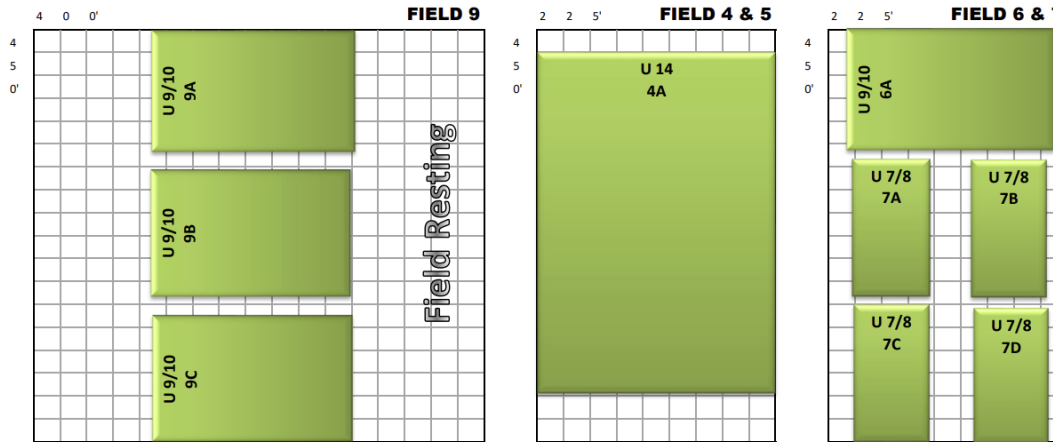

Check Anchoring of Goals Before Games

Soccer goal deaths: This has happened before

At first it sounds like a freak accident: A soccer net topples, killing a young person on a playing field, a place where kids are supposed to be safe.

But accidents involving soccer goals like the one **that killed a 15-year-old girl Wednesday afternoon** in Bradford, Ont., north of Toronto have happened before.

The girl was playing on the field with a friend when she became trapped under the crossbar of an overturned soccer net, according to South Simcoe police. Friends and teachers have identified the girl as Jaime Palm.

Unable to lift the heavy net, her friend called 911. Palm was rushed to hospital, where she died.

Police are investigating what caused the net to tip over but other — almost identical — accidents have prompted a push in some jurisdictions for laws requiring that soccer nets be anchored to the ground or switched out in favour of safer, tip-proof designs.

Rules and Regulations: Heading the Ball



I. HEADING THE BALL

1. Consistent with the U.S. Soccer mandates on heading the ball, heading is banned for all division players U-11 (U-12 and below for programs without single age divisions) and below in both practices and games. **Chippewa Valley Soccer League does not have a U11 Division – therefor heading is banned at the U12 and below divisions in the Chippewa Valley Soccer League.**

Heading for players in U-14 is limited to a maximum of thirty (30) minutes per week with no more than 15-20 headers, per player. There is no restriction on heading in matches.

2. An indirect free kick will be awarded to the opposing team if a player age 10 or younger, deliberately touches the ball with his/her head during a game.

- Joysticks are used to control computer games.
- In soccer, the term is used to refer to a coach who constantly yells out instructions to his players.

League Rules for Parents

All families received a general information sheet at registration. CVSL regrets having to start the season with a list of rules, but here they are anyway. Please read them thoroughly so that this soccer season can be successful and stress-free for everyone.

- **Do not allow any child or adult to hang from goals or nets.** If you see anyone hanging on or trying to hang on the goals, please instruct them to stop immediately. You may be saving their life or preventing a serious injury by doing so.
- **No Dogs** (no matter how big or small) are allowed at any CVSL game or practice – or at Soccer Park. This is for the safety and comfort of all spectators and players.
- **Please be considerate of residents** that live near soccer fields and do not block their mailboxes, block driveways, park in their driveways or lots or use driveways as turnarounds.
- **No Smoking or alcohol** is allowed at CVSL games or practices.
- **No Earrings, hair beads, hard barrettes or other jewelry** shall be worn during soccer games. If your child's ears were recently pierced, please **do not** show up with tape over the earrings or expect the referee to make an exception to the rule. Take the earrings out in the privacy of your home, not on the soccer field.
- **Do not communicate with referees during a game unless you have something positive to say.** It is challenging to referee a soccer game, and many of our referees are developing their skills at the same time your child is developing their soccer skills. It is essential that we retain our referees – too many have quit in the past because they were berated by a parent or coach.
- **Please stop any child that you see kicking the dirt** or digging with their feet, especially in front of goals. This bad habit creates dangerous holes on the field that can cause injuries.

Comments

- Running up scores
 - Strive for balanced teams – not always successful
 - Want everyone to have positive experience – both teams
 - Find a way to “pull back”..... possible ideas:
 - Strongest player(s) on defense
 - Encourage players to continue passing
 - No shots within the penalty area
 - At the discretion of the “winning” coach to make determination when lead is large enough to “pull back”

Game Rescheduling Information

Game rescheduling has always been a difficult process for our league, primarily due to the coordination effort required to do so. Here is the process for coaches to follow:

- 1) Reschedule only if you know in advance that you will not have enough players to field a team
- 2) You are allowed to “borrow” a player from another team. Let the Coach Administrator know in advance of this via email.
- 3) Contact the other coach to let him/her know you will be short players. Ask the other coach if they have enough subs to loan players to you throughout the game.
- 4) If no other options to fill your team out for a game – look to reschedule.
