



COACH INFORMATION – Important - Read both sides please!

PLEASE CONTACT YOUR PLAYERS BY August 29th! You may utilize your Team Page on our league website www.ayso803.org to communicate with your team.

PRACTICES. Practices may begin on or after August 28th at City Parks and on or after September 1st at ECASD sites. Games may begin on September 9th. Consult the "Practice Field Availability Sheet" for practice locations and days we may utilize.

Practice should be scheduled for 4:30 pm or later on weekdays. Before the season begins on September 9th arrange at least one and ideally two practices for your team. Once games start, one practice is sufficient and if you are playing two games that week, practicing during the week may not be necessary.

If you do not have a co-coach present at a practice, please be aware that you <u>must have another adult</u> with you at all <u>practices</u>. You may need to ask a parent to stay if you find yourself to be the only coach there. You, as the coaches, determine when and where the team practices. If a parent is late picking up a child after a practice or game, do not leave the child unattended. Wait or have another parent wait with the child and make it clear to the parent involved that they need to be prompt.




Set Expectation Level

Rules – Key Points

- Ball in and out of play
 - -U6/U7 try to limit stoppage
 - -Throw in technique not important
- Coaches on the field only at U6
- Substitution Rule free substitution, but strongly encourage substitutions at quarter breaks





Rules – Key Points

- No Goal Keepers U6, U7, U8
- Parents at opposite side of field
- No Offside Rule enforced until U12
- No Slide Tackling U10 and younger safety
- No Talking to Referees

Condensed Rules of Soccer for the AYSO Region 803 / Fall 2023


1. FIELD OF PLAY (see diagram)

2. THE BALL

Size 5 U14 & up Size 4 U9 thru U12 Size 3 U8 & below

3. NUMBER OF PLAYERS

U6 4 per side, no goalkeeper, no referee.
U7&U8 4 per side, no goalkeeper.
U9&U10 7 per side which includes a goalkeeper
U11&U12 9 per side which includes a goalkeeper
U14 & up 11 per side which includes a goalkeeper.




4. PLAYER UNIFORMS

Uniform will consist of a jersey, shorts, socks, shin guards (covered by socks), and footwear. The player shall not wear anything that is dangerous to another player (jewelry, casts, improper footwear). The goalkeeper shall wear colors that distinguish him/her from the other players and from the referee. Casts (hard or soft) are <u>not</u> allowed in either games or practice.

5. REFEREES

One referee shall be appointed to officiate each match for ages U8 and older. The referee is responsible for control of the game and his/her decisions are final. Registered parents who have taken the referee/linesperson clinic will be asked to act as referee on the field if an official referee is not available.

At first it sounds like a freak accident: A soccer net topples, killing a young person on a playing field, a place where kids are supposed to be safe

But accidents involving soccer goals like the one **that killed a 15-year- old girl Wednesday afternoon** in Bradford, Ont., north of Toronto have happened before.

The girl was playing on the field with a friend when she became trapped under the crossbar of an overturned soccer net, according to South Simcoe police. Friends and teachers have identified the girl as Jaime Palm

Unable to lift the heavy net, her friend called 911. Palm was rushed to hospital, where she died.

Police are investigating what caused the net to tip over but other — almost identical — accidents have prompted a push in some jurisdictions for laws requiring that soccer nets be anchored to the ground or switched out in favour of safer, tip-proof designs.



Game Rescheduling Information

Game rescheduling has always been a difficult process for our league, primarily due to the coordination effort required to do so. Here is the process for coaches to follow:

- Reschedule only if you know in advance that you will not have enough players to field a team
- 2) You are allowed to "borrow" a player from another team. Let the Coach Administrator know in advance of this via email.
- 3) Contact the other coach to let him/her know you will be short players. Ask the other coach if they have enough subs to loan players to you throughout the game.
- 4) If no other options to fill your team out for a game look to reschedule.

Heading the Ball – Banned at U12 and Younger

Consistent with the U.S. Soccer mandates on heading the ball, heading is banned for all division players U-11 (U-12 and below for programs without single age divisions) and below in both practices and games. Chippewa Valley Soccer League does not have a U11 Division – therefore heading is banned at the U12 and below divisions in the Chippewa Valley Soccer League.



Heading for players in U-14 is limited to a maximum of thirty (30) minutes per week with no more than 15-20 headers, per player. There is no restriction on heading in matches.

The Guidelines state that the prohibition is on deliberate heading, not unintentional heading.

So, a player whose head is hit by the ball, but did not clearly intend for it to do so, is not guilty of an offense. In addition, should a player get hit in the head with the ball with significant force to cause concern, stop play and restart as you would for an injury.

"If it's deliberate, do you always enforce the requirement?" The short answer is yes, if the heading is deliberate, it must be called; even advantage cannot be applied (as in the case where a defender deliberately heads the ball and inadvertently scores an own goal).

The restart for deliberate heading is an indirect free kick, at the point of the infraction; unless it happens in the attacking goal area, in which case, as with any other indirect free kick offense, the restart is on the goal line, nearest to where the offense happened, parallel to the goal line.
